Report From The President

Hello again, girls! It seems like only a couple of months ago when Fran asked me to write for the 1968 Annual Report. Funny, how like a snowball one's life is. When both are small their velocity is very low and as they grow they begin to move faster. When they reach adult age and size, time moves all too swiftly and the increased number of things to be done seems to put additional pressure on one to get them done before both you and the snowball fall over the precipice which is the annihilation of both. That's the way it seems to me. My life slips away at a greatly accelerated rate. Anyone past 40 will agree. All I can say to those less than 40 is "get with it girl and do it now whatever it may be so that you will have the time to enjoy it".

For FPE, it has been a good year. As an organization, we too are gaining speed. As we gain members, they not only add to groups already in existence, but gradually coalesce into little nuclei in new spots. Although I held the first organizational meeting with the girls in the Baltimore-Wash. D.C. area last May, it wasn't until the 1968-69 fiscal year (July to July) that the Rho Chapter really came into being. Likewise, although Sally in Houston was desperately trying to find prospects in the great reaches of Texas, it was only in this past year that enough members accumulated to make up a real chapter there, now termed the "Iota" Chapter. The area is even about to bud off another chapter, "Omega", since we now have four girls in Tulsa, Okla., Denver is now a going concern; Phoenix, Arizona has its nucleus; Hartford, Conn. is about to bud off from the Gamma group in Boston. Detroit has blossomed into the Beta Chapter; Toronto, Atlanta, Dallas, Ft. Worth, Eastern Pennsylvania, and St. Louis are beginning to show the makings of groups. In spite of the large representation of members in New York City and environs, attempts to organize a formal chapter there have never been successful. But finally this too is occurring, thanks to Conny. Congratulations to all the new groups and "almost groups". It's certainly more fun to "live" in the presence of friends than in the closet, isn't it!

Unfortunately, the effort to find new sisters still falls largely on Transvestia and on my appearances on radio and TV. If we could find more people quicker, we would really get our snowball moving faster and those of you who are still just one or two in an area would have more friends to meet with. The Epsilon Chapter in the San Francisco Bay area provided a great example with the ad which they ran in the Berkeley Barb (and which I subsequently ran in the LA Free Press). This ad was reprinted in TVia #55, page 46 in the hope that some of the rest of you would follow their lead. You don't have to be a group. Do it as an individual and put it in some locally circulated newspaper. Just change the Dept. No. to the first 3 digits of your zip code so we'll know where inquiries come from. You would not only be helping someone who needs the help as much as you did, but would in due course, have more friends in your own area.

Many of you who still see the Femme Forum no longer subscribe to TVia, so I have no way of reaching you except in this annual message. You have, so to speak, "graduated" in the sense that you no longer feel the need for counselling, reading, pictures, helps of one kind or another, etc., that you did when you first came into the fold some years ago. I do so wish, however, that you would hark back to those days when you first found TVia and the sense of belonging, of being

no longer alone that it gave you. If you could recall your "freshman" feelings perhaps you could be induced to do a little bit to find and help those who are today where you were "then"! Oh I know, the world is a lot more accepting in certain areas than it was then, but the loneliness that the "undiscovered" TV feels is the same today as it was then. Can't many of you place ads, write articles (even anonymously) for some local paper or magazine giving Chevalier's address), write to columnists urging them to refer inquiring readers to the Foundation for Personality Expression at Chevalier's address, or at the very least, invest \$2.00 to have a copy of the Wives book put in your own City Library (or better....in some of the branches too)? Won't you do SOMETHING to help? I am amazed, disappointed and slightly appalled by the number of people who will take but will not give. I am particularly disappointed that there are a few in each chapter who continue to partake of the benefits of a chapter group and yet, do not pay their share of the support of the efforts of the organization. We ought to be able to depend on the dues payments to Fran by those who continue to enjoy the sisterhood of FPE.

It is a bit ironical, but fortunate, that the two TV programs that offered to pay me for my lodging and transportation for my appearances were also those which did the best jobs for us. The Allen Burke (New York) and Allen Douglas (Cleveland) shows were both syndicated and thus showed in a number of cities that I would never have reached otherwise. It was from these shows that a number of our newer members originated, so we can all be thankful for their assistance. Although Allen Burke is off of the air, Allen Douglas has asked me to appear on both his radio and TV shows in September, so we will get another ground with him. By the time this reaches you all, I will be in the middle of an European and American tour which will, I'm sure, find us a lot of new contacts. I will be able to meet with our Swedish, Danish and British sisters, attend a couple of professional conferences and have a couple of newspaper interviews in Europe. In the U.S., there will be 25 lectures, radio and TV appearances and seminars. This should bring forth a great many of our previously hidden sisters. So, we should look forward to an upsurge of membership in FPE about 6 months from now. As revealed in Fran's financial report, the Foundation has contributed to the costs of this tour in the amount of \$300 and many individuals have made donations toward its cost, which will be considerable, as it ranges from Minneapolis to Atlanta and Boston to Houston to Denver. Thanks to all who have directly or indirectly helped out.

I hope that each of you that receives the Forum takes a minute to realize the amount of time and effort which is put into keeping this organization going. It is not a profit-making, salary-paying organization, as you know. I know how much time it takes me being the mail girl for Fran, processing applications, etc. but this is as nothing to the job that Fran does and is doing in handling the problems, processing the memberships, writing letters, counselling, and last but by no means least, publishing this Forum. I for one have never regretted my selection of her to be our Executive Secretary and I hope the rest of you would take the occasion sometimes to show your own appreciation with a card, letter or whatever. We wouldn't be the organization we are without her.

In summary, of our year's activities then, we have continued to grow and expand in number of members, in number of groups and chapters, and hopefully in love and understanding of ourselves and each other. Those of us who have been able to free our feminine sides from some of the shackles of masculinity are to that degree fuller and richer human beings, and by the same token, we have therefore greater responsibilities to try to help others....male and female, TV and

non-TV to appreciate their own humanity and to respect it in all.....friend or foe. Only when more of the gentility and love that resides under the surface of human beings can be liberated and expressed will there be an end to violence, war and the hurtful aspects of competition which a surfeit of masculine aggressiveness has saddled upon the world. We should be able to see it better than others and do our small bit in our own little worlds to level things out. Remember again, the quotation used every time in TVia....."When you make the male and the female into a single one, then shall ye enter the kingdom". Of course, HE meant gender not sex, the masculine and the feminine into a single one. This WE can do, so let us be thankful for that ability.

Report From The Executive Secretary

As you can see by the foregoing information, things continue to happen in FPE. Our total membership as of June 30, 1969 is 315 which is a net increase of 77 over last year. We enrolled 100 new members this past year which was an increase of 30 over our previous year. There are also about 30 pending applicants in process at the present time. Our persistency was better than ever this past year in that there were only approximately 50 "drop-outs" which was nearly half of the amount of "non-pays" or "resignations" of past years.

We had definite growth number-wise and I believe quality-wise also. The number of younger FP's with understanding GG's is ever increasing. It is amazing to see these new applicants come along and have already achieved a solid degree of self-understanding as well as help from their GG's. In reflecting on this, it would seem that many years and dollars invested into public relations and education is paying off. The wives' book, which was a big undertaking by many of us in helping Virginia to publish it, is probably the biggest reason for better understanding from the GG's involved. Also getting this book on the "local library" shelf is doing a great deal to educate the public in general as well as bring forth prospective new members. Those of you whom have purchased TVias or the Wives' book and gotten the local book store to sell them or to buy them directly from Chevalier Publications have contributed a great deal. We urge you to continue to do so because your effort is directly related to new members coming in via the book store approach.

This is our third year of helping to finance a goodwill tour for Virginia. I believe that this method of public relations is perhaps our most effective. Through Virginia's appearances on radio and television programs, we have been able to reach the widest possible audience and thus educate more and more of the public. These appearances have brought forth the greatest number of new members

over any other source because we can easily trace our applicants back to a particular TV or radio program at which time they picked up the address and found new hope in their lonely pursuit of self-expression. Whenever Virginia appears on one of these programs there are numerous requests for information from that specific area and within a few months, several new applicants appear on the scene. So, if we had more money to spend on books and public appearances, our growth and effectiveness would be that much greater.

It really is a shame that every year we have to loose the support of a good number of members because their dues money would be the additional dollars we need to expand our efforts. The thing that is a bit disturbing is that most of the dropouts are still active in many chapters and enjoying the benefits that we all have to support. It seems that nearly every group has two or three past members who live it up at the meetings, yet refuse to meet their financial obligation to the organization. Since money and the collection of dues is still our number one problem, we will greatly appreciate your individual help in getting these "hangers-on" to do their share. You can easily tell who is or is not paid by looking at the membership roster enclosed with this report. If they have not paid their dues for this year as of June 30th, they do not appear on the roster. Another way to find out is to ask them for the 1969 membership card, and if they do not have one they are not a member in good standing. It would be wonderful not to have to mention this problem area or spend so much time each year in tracking down dues money. Your help will really be appreciated.

You will note that six members were able to make contributions this past year in donating some extra dollars. We are most thankful to these members and to those who contributed to the "Travel Fund Request" for Virginia to help cover some of her expense on her current world tour. There are lots of places for these dollars girls, and we do appreciate them, believe me!

You can also see that we were able to operate in the black again this year and have some money left over to start the new fiscal year. So things are looking up a bit in this department. We were most pleased to be able to send some money back to Alpha toward their open house for professional guests. Also, we were able to send some dollars to the Swedish group to help cover printing costs in converting the Introduction leaflet into German for distribution in Europe. The Epsilon Chapter has been running ads in the campus paper at Berkley and FPE made a contribution to that project. So, for the first time, FPE International was able to help support some local projects and we hope to be able to continue to honor requests for groups who have a worthwhile project in mind.
