To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this letter is to set the record straight regarding the above-listed matter. I never ordered any materials from Quill Corporation. The order was placed by a prisoner correspondent of mine, Dee Farmer, who is incarcerated at the Federal Correctional Institution, Florence, Colorado. Dee, a jailhouse litigator, asked if she could have the legal supplies sent to my house until she could receive official approval from the prison administration to have them sent to her. Several months ago, she was able to receive approval for some of the supplies and I sent them in to her.

I have not responded to your earlier letters because Dee assured me the matter was being dealt with. I asked her on a number of occasions to write to Quill Corporation and straighten this misunderstanding out. I assumed that she had done so. In the interim, however, as life often goes with prisoners, Dee was abruptly moved to another prison, and unable to correspond for quite some time.

I am still in receipt of roughly one-half of the legal materials ordered by Dee Farmer. I would be happy to return them to Quill or Dun & Bradstreet so that they may be credited toward the bill. Please advise which would be preferable. I would then ask you to send a revised bill directly to Dee Farmer, #23288-037, FCI Florence, P.O. Box 6000, Florence, CO 81226. She is the responsible person in this matter. Ms. Farmer has assured me that she intends to pay for these materials.
