### Report From The President

Would you believe?.....another year has rolled around and it's time for another Annual Report. This girl, for one, finds a few more wrinkles, a slightly larger pot, a little more fatigue and other signs that "time marches on"; also an increased amount of impatience that there are so many things to be done, so many experiences to have, so much understanding and knowledge to achieve and such rapidly decreasing time to do it in. Oh well, that's the way it is and we all have to face it.

But what has happened to our organization during this past year? Well, it has absorbed a great deal of effort and time, principally on the part of Fran, our able and (thank God) willing Executive Secretary, but also from the Councillors, other office rs and myself. But that is to be expected. We have achieved a lot of new members during the year whose names have been inserted into the Femme Forum each issue. Inevitably, we have lost others--some through the attrition of time, some from frustration and some from what we might call a surfeit of independence.

I would like to say a few words about these last two. No organization is created with a full-fledged membership, anymore than a baby is born full grown. Neither was FPE. However, many members and former members wrote and talked as though they expected it to be a big going concern of thousands of members with vast programs of research, education, public relations, legal activities, etc. They seemed to forget that you have to get born, gather your strength to crawl, learn to balance to walk and develop coordination to run. It's the same with an organization, and with a TV organization it is pretty difficult to even get born let alone crawling, walking and running. There are thousands of TVs around, I'm sure, but you don't just go out and buy a mailing list of them. They are something like gold or diamonds...hard to find and only capable of being mined by certain techniques. These techniques we have been developing over the last nine years starting with TRANSVESTIA magazine. Unhappily, some of those found early get bored with the birth pains--that is the relative inactivity, the gathering-strength period and said that since they didn't get so much out of it, they would drop out. Had they realized that their continued membership in terms of numbers and their continued financial support through their dues was what was necessary to gain the strength to crawl, they could have helped the organization even as they had been helped. But these people dropped away through unpaid dues because they were the type that wanted everything done for them. They were not particularly anxious to put their shoulders to the wheel to so something constructive for the organization and the "cause" even if it was only to continue as members so that they could be counted(both numerically and financially). They were the frustrated ones. They wanted to walk before the organization could crawl and they were unwilling to stick around and help it grow to that stage.

Then there were those with a surfeit of independence. By this, I mean that FPE (and I suppose any service or problem-solving organization) served a purpose as it was intended to do in the lives of these persons. They joined it when they were alone and lonely and met others; when they were relatively unsophisticated

about how others dealt with their problems and they learned; when they lacked some measure of self-acceptance, understanding and confidence, these they acquired through their contacts with others. Having made these gains, they consciously or unconsciously said to themselves in effect, "I am no longer alone, I have TV friends, I now know what I am and what I am not, I have gained considerable awareness of myself and I have learned self-acceptance; learned how to make a more presentable girl and I am now confident...I can stand on my own feet(his heels of course). What do I NOW need FPE for." Such independent spirits move off on their own with little regard for the mother that brought them up, nurtured them and might reasonably expect some help from the older children in the rearing of the younger ones which followed. "That's gratitude for ya" as Amos and Andy used to say.(That dates me, doesn't it?)

I hope that those presently in the organization will, appreciating what benefits they may have acquired through my efforts in Transvestia and subsequently Fran's efforts in FPE, stick with it, support it, invent and take part in programs designed to accomplish something for the cause and actively seek to repay those benefits they have received through further activities aimed at helping other TVs or educating the public.

As most who read this will already know, during the period July 1966 to July 1968, I have traveled East three times appearing on various radio and TV shows each time. This presentation of the subject has brought forth many new readers of TVia and subsequently, many new members of FPE and much new enthusiasm. Part of the expenses of the last trip were paid for out of the FPE treasury, (and the rest by contributions of individual TVia readers) and would not have been possible without this help. Thus, your dues directly helped in the public relations work that has been done. We don't have a great amount of money available for projects, so we have to allocate it with a view to where it will do the most good. One new idea that I will take up with the other officers is that of extending financial aid from the national organization to individual chapters(or individuals for that matter) whose efforts or projects are considered to be of wide enough value to warrant it. This is just like the federal government appropriating federal money to a state or city government to support projects of merit.

But all projects do not have to originate with national headquarters, local chapters or with me, as your President or as Transvestia publisher; they can originate with you. One excellent example is the idea presented by and acted upon by Eloise 21 F-3 FPE, who, finding no good publications and some very inappropriate ones in the Boston Public Library, wrote to them about it. Others have bought the Wives Book from Chevalier(at half price, just for this very purpose) and presented it to their libraries. Others have had library-sized cards printed to be inserted into library index files. Still others have called radio and TV stations and made first contacts that I was able to follow through on to arrange appearances. There are things that you as individuals can do and should do to help. FPE has its social side alright, but it wasn't founded only as an organization to take from, but as one through which you could give to. Remember JFK's famous directive, "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country." Substitute "FPE" for "country" in the statement and it is equally valid.

In this connection, I think we ought to mention the scurrilous attack on Transvestia, myself as Editor, FPE and all TVs in general in that monument to yellow journalism known as Confidential. The November, 1967 issue carried the original

attack. As a result of my report about it in TVia and an appeal to readers to write to Confidential, a number of them did so. Confidential printed 12 letters, 11 of them from FPE members. In doing so, they got 12 different slants on the same thing. Not that it did anything to change the personal attitude of the Editors, but I'm sure it provided additional information to lots of readers.

The girls of our affiliated sister organization in Stockholm(FPE of North Europe) did themselves proud too. Primarily through the efforts of Annette FS-K-1 FPE and Yvonne FS-S-1 FPE, who allowed themselves to be interviewed and even pictured (Yvonne), they got a long descriptive article in Sweden's biggest newspaper "Expresse ". This was an excellent effort, an excellent interview(it will be published in translation in TVia) and certainly did a magnificent job for the cause in that country. Congratulations to them. Couldn't some of our girls do this over here too with proper safeguards for security? How about it???

One of our newer members in Portland, Oregon, found an article in a newspaper column dealing with a Drag Ball the local gays were putting on and in which he referred to them as Transvestites. Our girl, Donna 37 B-4 FPE had the initiative and the guts to call this columnist on the phone and speak to him about the difference between TVs and drag queens and then sent him one of my "Introduction to TVism" leaflets. The result was that he published a new column apologizing for his misuse of the term and discussing the subject briefly in the right light. This little effort on Donna's part means that probably several tens of thousands of people had it drawn to their attention that there is a difference. What ingenuity can YOU bring to bear on the problem? As the man said, "Don't just stand there.....!"

One of the main projects that should be undertaken some day is a survey in a representative city aimed at finding out approximately how many TVs there are per 1000 population. I have worked out a way to do this, but to do it very thoroughly would require about \$5,000. This we obviously don't have, but any of you with enough in your fortune to contribute toward this project, would certainly be welcome. The money would be held earmarked just for that project. If any feel that they would like to contribute a reasonable amount to this and want further information as to how I plan to do it before making such a contribution, let me know and I will explain. If we could prove to interested persons and institutions how many there really are, we might be able to get further research grants and other helps.

In conclusion, a comment about the "state of the nation" may be in order. Public tolerance for all forms of sexual behaviour is as most of us realize, continuing to increase each year. For example, the absurd law under which one of our members was prosecuted in New York State several years ago has been replaced by more intelligent legislation. It is no longer illegal in New York for one or even two males in feminine attire to be on public streets, but with three, it becomes a violation of the masquerade ordinance. This is doubtless aimed at the gay queens rather than a burst of understanding of TVs, but it does take the heat off of residents in that state. Massachusetts also was found to have no law against cross-dressing. I am going to try during the coming year, to make a survey of all states and large cities as to their legal position on the matter. This too, I am proposing as an FPE sponsored program.

More and more books dealing with the subject in one way or another are appearing. They are by no means all "good literature", but they do recognize the existence

of TVism and thus spread information about it to the world at large. Greater understanding and tolerance is being found among wives of incoming members as Fran reported in a recent Forum. This too is a straw in the wind. Things are easing up gradually, but there is a long way to go. What can you do to help???

#### Report From The Executive Secretary

Our membership grew from 181 in 1967 to 238 paid members as of June 30, 1968. We welcomed into FPE 70 new members which was our greatest gain thus far. So our membership situation is the best ever and we are processing new member applications nearly every week. I believe that we can expect a considerable amount of growth in the coming year due to our public relations and education program, reaching numerous new sources as well as some other programs designed to touch new areas in the coming months. Along with new members, we seem to have reached a fairly good level for keeping old members with us. I believe that more of our members are beginning to see something deeper in FPE than their personal gain. We also know that through our new Councillor and Interviewer system we can get to more members faster and help them in more ways. Our financial position wasn't too bad this past year, thanks to those who paid their dues on time and the constant flow of new members. We also had some very welcome donations. I think a special word of thanks should go to: Annette 12 F-1, Cheryl 13 S-7, Rita 13 N-1 and Betsy in Rhode Island, a non-member, for their donations to our work. Thank you ladies, we appreciate your financial help!

#### New Regional System

We mentioned in Femme Forum No. 15 that we were about to make some important changes in our divisions of geographical areas. These changes were necessitated by the fact that naming areas by Greek letters made it too difficult to change them and add new ones. Also, the Chapters were already being named after Greek letters which made it a bit confusing. There just wasn't enough flexibility in our former system. Effective with this report, we have a new system for naming the areas as well as locating an Interviewer in them. Perhaps the word Interviewer needs defining at this point in order to better understand our new area system. An "Interviewer" is a member appointed by the Executive Secretary and National President who has the responsibility of screening and helping new members in order that they will be able to become "full members" and meet other members of FPE. Thus the Interviewer is a bit more limited than our Councillors were as far as authority is concerned, but just as vital as far as membership is concerned. Our present Councillors will automatically become Interviewers along with their other duties. We hope to make some additional changes in our Councillor system in the coming months.

As far as geographic locations are concerned, we were in dire need of a more functional system than the Greek letter method, so we have adopted a zip code system. Under the new system we are able to expand more easily by drawing from the master postal zip code numbering system when there are some new members in a new area. For example, in New York State we now have members in the central and upper part of the state as well as New York City. We also expect growth in the Western part of the state (Rochester-Buffalo area), so we simply selected three master zip codes in the central areas of our membership and then appointed two additional Interviewers to cover these areas. So where we had one very large region before called NU, we now have three areas called #100, #140 and #135. Any chapters that develop in the areas or within a combination of several

areas can select their name by Greek letter as before without confusing the entire situation. We hope to have an Interviewer in every major population area and have it numbered by the central zip code even though the Interviewer is the only one located there for the time being. So, as our membership shifts or expands, there will be someone ready to help them. We are not trying to cut down the territory of any present Councillor, but merely trying to make the service to our new members much faster which has been a very big problem in the past, and also to anticipate continued growth.

The membership roster enclosed with this report will be set up according to the new system and should help to explain why these changes were necessary. Throughout the coming year we will be subdividing present areas and adding many new ones. The key problem to this program is finding enough good Interviewers to go around. If any of you feel qualified and inclined to help us, please let us know. You will note that we did not include the town or city in which our members live because there was some objection to this. However, we felt strongly that our members did have a right to know who lives fairly near them, so under the new zip code idea, we listed the first three numbers of the zip code of the area of the member's mailing address. We think this plan will satisfy both demands and not violate any rights of personal security.

Special Request

If your zip code does not appear on the envelope that you receive from FPE with this report in it, please send us your correct Zip Code immediately! Postal regulations require zip codes effective right now, so please help us comply with the law and avoid any delay in getting your mail to you! Thank you!!!!

Booklet Enclosed

There is a booklet enclosed with this report called, "An Introduction to the Subject of Transvestism or Femmiphilia". The booklet is sent to you now so that you will all be acquainted with this great piece of material that we use for public relations. It can be sent to professional or law enforcement agencies or left with a doctor or anyone else that you hope to educate just a bit. Additional copies are available through Virginia in any quantity at 10¢ a copy. If you want several copies sent to someone or some organization, just send the money and the correct address, and we will mail them out for you or send them to you. Each new member will get a copy with her enrollment kit from this point on. Now that you have one in your possession, why not let it do some good?

If those of you who know of or run across something worth reviewing will send the information on to Jeri via Fran, and we will have even broader coverage.

Femme Forum

Our newsletter continues to roll on bi-monthly and we hope it has served the very important role of keeping you informed. It is a very big job, but we feel that most of you continue to appreciate the effort. We should give a very special vote of thanks to the Contributing Editors: Sheila 30 B-2 for her reports on Research and Education, as well as those informative tid-bits she includes from time to time; Laura 35 S-2 has been doing a wonderful job as Social Editor, but could use some additional help from all of you in getting the chapter and other social news to her. We can only report on what you send us ladies!! Jeri's literary reviews have gone over well and as mentioned above, we hope to continue this service in the coming year. As far as the other aspects of the Forum, we continue to seek your suggestions and contributions to make our newsletter as good as we possibly can. Let's keep the communications path a two-way channel ladies by letting us know what you think and want. Remember that we always start editing on the first day of September, November, January, March and May, so allow enough time for your letter or material to arrive with either Sheila, Laura, Fran or Virginia before the first of those months we go to press.
